Program Description and Application

Purpose of the Program:

To provide emerging leaders with an opportunity to explore the theory and practice of what it means to be a spiritual leader; and get a more systemic overview of the Fellowship as an institution; and form deep relationships with fellow participants.

- Be open to your own spiritual growth and encouraging it in others.
- Interest in developing your and others' leadership skills in service to the Fellowship and other arenas.
- Willingness to consider future leadership roles in the congregation.
- Demonstrate respect and interest in fellow participants and their stories.

Qualifications:

This class is best suited for Fellowship members (those who have formally signed our membership book) or people who have otherwise made a strong commitment to the congregation. High school aged youth and adults welcome.

Amount of Time Required:

There will be two retreats (held at the Fellowship), one encompassing a Friday evening and Saturday and the other occurring on a Saturday. There will be approximately four to eight weekday evening sessions, some requiring minimal homework (such as the invitation to bring a song lyric that is meaningful to you).

Length of Commitment:

Fall 2019 (specific dates and times TBD).

The elected Leadership Development Committee, with the support and participation of ministers and staff.
