

## **Fellowship Sunday Education Coordinator**

### **Position Description and Application**

#### **Purpose of the Position:**

To assist the Director of Religious Education and Director of Religious Education Assistant in working with targeted Fellowship committees (i.e. Pastoral Care, worship Leaders, etc. to create meaningful educational experiences for RE students to compliment our monthly Fellowship Sunday program.

#### **Responsibilities:**

- Work directly with pre-determined Fellowship committees to help the DRE create meaningful educational experiences for monthly Sunday education programs.
- Brainstorm and craft meaningful children and youth breakout activities for each monthly gathering.
- Act as an occasional liaison between the committees and DRE.
- Participate in monthly Fellowship Sunday classes throughout the program year.
- Continual informal and year end formal evaluation of the program in a way that includes feedback from participants and leaders.
- Meet or communicate twice per month with the DRE to discuss lesson and activity plans for each month during the program year.

#### **Qualifications:**

- 1) A deep sense of love and respect for children and youth
- 2) Respect for and a basic understanding of the Unitarian Universalist Principles and introduce justice work experiences to Fellowship students
- 3) Willingness to be "on the journey" together as you learn and grow with our young people-to be adaptable to class needs
- 4) Ability to communicate your needs to the committees, DRE, and DREA

- 5) A basic understanding of child development
- 6) A sense of fun!

**Amount of Time Required:**

Approximately 8-10 (including three-four hours on Fellowship Sundays) hours per month in addition to training.

**Length of Commitment:**

One to two years, with the possibility of renewal, starting in the summer or fall 2019 (initial training TBD).

**Training and Support Provided by:**

Provided by the DRE and others including an orientation session at the start of the year, regular contact with the DRE, opportunities for workshops and training both in-house and denominationally and meetings as needed to address specific issues
