

WORSHIP LEADER

Position Description & Application

Purpose of the Position:

To assist the minister(s) in the planning and leadership of worship services.

Responsibilities:

- Attend training and regular meetings of Worship Arts Team (see time requirements, below).
- Work with the preaching minister in researching and planning the services approximately every-other-month.
- Serve as Worship Leader on the assigned weekends for both Sunday services. This typically includes helping co-lead parts of the service as assigned and often also includes a 3-4 minute reflection on the theme for the service.

Qualifications:

Worship Leaders should be members or pledging friends of the Fellowship with at least one year of experience of attending worship at the Fellowship. Worship leaders will be effective public speakers and will have a passion for spiritual exploration and learning. They should have a commitment to excellent worship and be open to constructive feedback.

Amount of Time Required:

- Meet with the preaching minister in advance of the service (approximately 1-2 hours).
- Co-lead all worship services assigned; arrive at least 45 minutes prior to the start of the service (4.5 hours during program year, 2 hours during summer).
- Attend quarterly meetings of Worship Arts Team (2-3 hours).
- Possible special trainings would include: sermon writing; liturgy & music; poems & prayers, etc. (to be scheduled).

Length of Commitment:

Two years, with the possibility of renewing for an additional two years. After term ends, can re-apply to serve as a Worship Leader after a time off of three years.

Training and Support Provided by:

The minister(s).
