Incumbent Vice-President

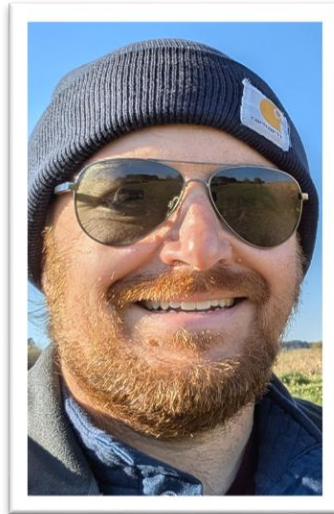

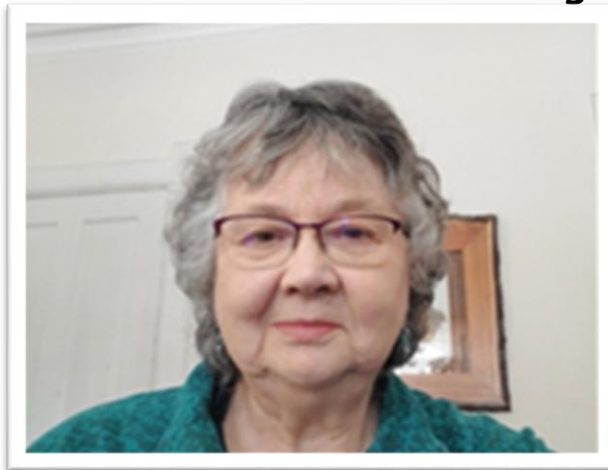

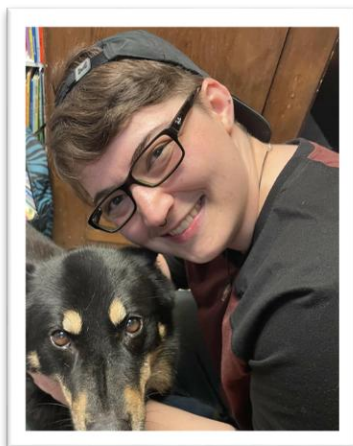
